## **Successful Zonal Workshop on MEAL Concludes in Bangalore**

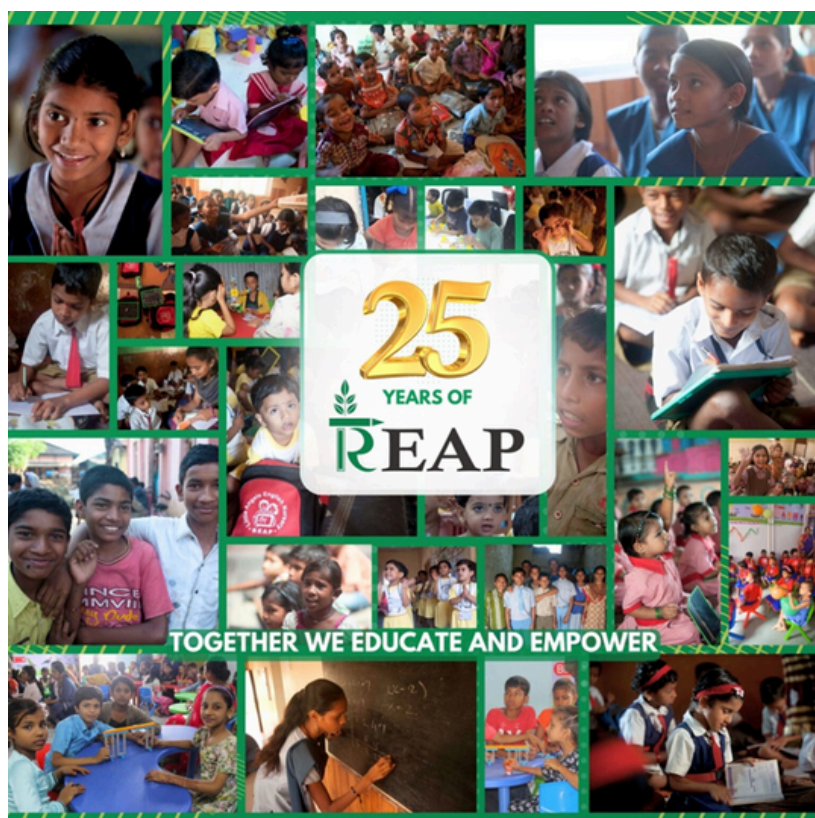
